Festival Interceltique Lorient

In August, the Prince Charles Pipe Band was a featured guest band at the 51st Festival Interceltique de Lorient in Brittany, France. This was our third time being invited to the Festival and it was every bit as magical and fun as the previous visits. We brought 31 performing members and 19 family guests; most of the group had not been on our earlier trips.

Over the Festival's ten days, the Band played in 5 Stadium shows, 4 parades, 3 staged concerts, a "Battle of the Bands" field show (vs. the Galician pipe band!), countless rehearsals and everyone's favorite, the epic Bumper Car Derby.

It was an amazing adventure, far exceeding our admittedly high expectations. We created shared memories that will last a lifetime: immersing ourselves in new experiences and cultures (with music and dance being common to all!), meeting new friends, performing for incredible audiences, playing pipes and drums day in and day out. The bonds forged as a result of the trip without a doubt will pay future dividends for the Band.

Prince Charles Junior Pipe Band Sweep!

The band contests at Monterey (Jul 16 - 17) and Pleasanton (Sep 3 - 4) provided our Junior Band with a chance to test their mettle against other Western US pipe bands, and the results were clear wins in four out of four events! While the Monterey contests were tight – PCJrPB edged out the second-place bands by only 1 and 2 points – the Pleasanton contests were a run-away, with a consensus 1st place ranking by all the judges on each day. Way to start and finish strong!

The Band's consistent results and the contest judges' recommendations after hearing the Band play led the Western US Pipe Band Association (WUSPBA) to upgrade PCJrPB to Grade 4 for next year...the only Grade 5 band to be moved up.
